Patient Level Information and Costing Systems (PLICS) Early Implementers Collection for Community Health Services and for Acute Services for trusts not mandated for PLICS for FY 2020/21 data

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Background

The Health and Social Care Act 2012 (the 2012 Act) gives the Health and Social Care Information Centre, now known as NHS Digital and hereafter referred to by this name, statutory powers, under section 259(1)(a), to require data from health or social care bodies, or organisations that provide publicly funded health or adult social care in England, where it has been directed to establish an information system by the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care or NHS England or has received a Mandatory Request from a Principal Body defined in section 255(9) of the 2012 Act.

The data, as specified by NHS Digital in this published Data Provision Notice, is required to support a Mandatory Request from Monitor (now known as [NHS England and NHS Improvement](#)) to NHS Digital. Therefore, organisations that are in scope of the notice are legally required, under section 259(5) of the 2012 Act, to provide the data in the form and manner specified below.

Purpose of the collection

The purpose of this pilot collection is to test the collection and analysis of PLICS information from the Early Implementers that have agreed to participate (as set out at Annex A Section 2) and to enable NHS Improvement* to perform its pricing and licensing functions under the 2012 Act more effectively. It will:

- inform new methods of pricing NHS services;
- inform new approaches and other changes to the design of the currencies used to price NHS services;
- contribute to NHS Improvement's strategic objective of a 'single national cost collection';
- inform the relationship between provider characteristics and cost;
- help trusts to maximise use of their resources and improve efficiencies, as required by the provider licence;
- identify the relationship between patient characteristics and cost;
- identify the relationship between incident characteristics and cost; and
- support an approach to benchmarking for regulatory purposes.

** From 1 April 2019, NHS England and NHS Improvement are working together as a new single organisation to better support the NHS to deliver improved care for patients.*

Benefits of the collection

Understanding how providers spend money is essential in tackling short-term deficits; supporting the development of new models of care and reducing the variation in resource utilisation.

The level of data available in reference costs is not granular enough to easily identify potential efficiency gains. Such data is limited in its ability to reflect the complexity of patient

care and identify cost variation between individual patients. By implementing PLICS, a standardised method of reporting cost information at patient level this can be rectified. This will be produced by patient level information and costing systems (PLICS).

NHS England and NHS Improvement's Costing Transformation Programme (CTP) was set up to implement PLICS across all secondary care providers.

The CTP involves:

- introducing and implementing new standards for patient level costing;
- developing and implementing one single national cost collection to replace current multiple collections;
- establishing the minimum required standards for costing software and promoting its adoption; and
- driving and encouraging sector support to adopt Patient Level Costing methodology and technology.

This is a voluntary pilot collection which is being undertaken as part of the CTP and comprises data from 51 providers of Community Health and Acute services who have agreed to participate as per Annex A Section 2 of the Requirements Specification to the [Mandatory Request](#).

The insight obtained from this pilot collection will inform development of future mandatory collections of PLICS data planned to take place from 2022 onwards.

Legal basis for the collection, analysis, publication and dissemination

Collection

Under sections 255 and 256(2)(a) of the 2012 Act, NHS Digital has received a Mandatory Request from NHS Improvement (Monitor) to establish and operate such systems for the collection and analysis of information of PLICS data as per the Requirements Specification for Patient Level Information and Costing Systems (PLICS) Early Implementers Collection for Community Health Services and for Acute Services for trusts not mandated for PLICS for FY 2020/21 data.

The NHS Digital Executive Management Team (EMT) considered and accepted the Mandatory Request on 3 December 2021.

Publication and Analysis

NHS Digital and NHS England and NHS Improvement have agreed that NHS Digital must not publish the pilot data collected as part of this Mandatory Request under Section 260(1) of the 2012 Act due to the information obtained falling under Section 260(2)(a) and (b).

Data received at NHS Digital is validated against an XML (Extensible Markup Language) schema. The outcome of schema validation is provided to providers. Data is stored and then matched if relevant. Data is processed, including further data quality checks,

calculations and derivations being undertaken if relevant, and then pseudonymised before being provided to NHS Improvement.

Linkage

For PLICS data collected in 2021 under this Mandatory Request, the data is planned to be linked to HES (Hospital Episode Statistics) and CSDS (Community Services Data Set).

Data Dissemination

As this is a voluntary pilot collection for early implementers, NHS Improvement has requested that NHS Digital does not exercise the power conferred by section 261(1) of the 2012 Act, other than to disseminate information to such persons, for such purposes and at such times as may be agreed between NHS Digital and NHS Improvement. NHS Digital may also use its discretionary dissemination powers to provide information to a Provider Trust. Subject to a successful application being made to NHS Digital's Data Access Request Service (DARS), information that has been anonymised in line with the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) Anonymisation Code of Practice will be disseminated to NHS England and NHS Improvement.

A signed Data Sharing Framework Contract (DSFC) and Data Sharing Agreement (DSA) are each already in place between NHS Digital and NHS England and NHS Improvement.

A change to that DSA will require a further application through DARS and consideration by the [Independent Group Advising on the Release of Data \(IGARD\)](#).

Requests for data from external bodies for analysis and/or publication purposes will be outside the scope of this collection.

NHS Digital will not disseminate confidential patient information about an individual who has set a national data opt-out, where the national data opt-out policy applies.

Persons consulted

Following receipt of the Mandatory Request for the continued implementation of PLICS collections, NHS Digital has, as required under section 258 of the Health and Social Care Act 2012, consulted with the following persons:

- NHS England and NHS Improvement
- Trusts who have volunteered to take part in the early implementers collection for community health services and for acute services for trusts not mandated for PLICS for FY 2020/21 data as detailed in Annex A Section 2 of this document
- Representatives of other stakeholders who NHS Digital considers are likely to use the information to which the Mandatory Request relates, for example relevant Arm's Length Bodies (ALBs).

Scope of the collection

Under section 259(1)(a) of the Health and Social Care Act 2012, this Notice is served in accordance with the procedure published as part of the NHS Digital duty under section

259(8) on the trusts who have agreed to participate as set out in Annex A Section 2 of this Notice.

On receipt of this DPN, Trusts who have agreed to participate (as per Annex A Section 2) are legally required to submit activity and financial data as per Annex A Section 1 of the [Requirements Specification for Patient Level Information and Costing Systems \(PLICS\) Early Implementers Collection for Community Health Services and for Acute Services for trusts not mandated for PLICS for FY 2020/21 data](#) and associated [Mandatory Request](#).

Under section 259(5) of the 2012 Act the organisation types specified in the above Scope must comply with the Form, Manner and Period requirements below.

Form of the collection

The PLICS data to be collected can be found in Annex A Section 1 of the published [Requirements Specification for Patient Level Information and Costing Systems \(PLICS\) Early Implementers Collection for Community Health Services and for Acute Services for trusts not mandated for PLICS for FY 2020/21 data](#) and associated [Mandatory Request](#).

The [Extract Specification](#) for this collection is available on the Open Learning Platform (OLP).

Submissions will be sent in XML format. The format and structure of the XML files are detailed in the [Schema](#) on the OLP.

Manner of the collection

Providers submitting data will transfer it in a secure manner, using the NHS Digital [Secure Electronic File Transfer \(SEFT\)](#) platform.

This service is currently used to submit a range of information. The platform is a web-based solution that does not require the installation of any software, apart from the use of a compatible [web browser](#).

The collection will also be supported by a range of technical and business controls at NHS Digital, including validation of data submitted against the XML Schema.

Period of the collection

The data collection is scheduled to take place from 9am on 20 December 2021 to 5pm on 28 January 2022 inclusive. Data can only be submitted within this time-period.

This is a one-off pilot collection of data relating to Financial Year 2020/21 data to test the collection process and analysis of PLICS information from Early Implementers that have agreed to participate, as per Annex A Section 2.

NHS England and NHS Improvement has also issued further communications to providers on the scheduling of submissions within the above dates.

Transparency

As NHS Digital is collecting personal data from Trusts through this collection, Trusts have a legal duty to be transparent and to provide patients with transparency information under Articles 13 and 14 of the UK GDPR about the data they are sharing with NHS Digital. Trusts should therefore consider whether they need to update their own Transparency materials to include details of this collection.

Data quality

Data quality will be supported by a range of technical and business controls at NHS Digital, including validation of data submitted against the XML Schema.

The [Community PLICS voluntary cost collection guidance 2020/21](#) published by NHS England and NHS Improvement on the OLP contains further guidance for Trusts prior to and during data submission.

As a pilot data collection exercise an aspect of this collection is to help identify and inform possible data quality issues that can help and support the development of future mandated collections of this data.

Sensitive and Legally restricted data – guidance for the collection

Trusts will not submit data in PLICS for patients receiving services or treatments where there is sensitive/legally restricted data.

The list of excluded data covers the below treatment and diagnosis categories:

- HIV and AIDS
- sexually transmitted disease
- gender re-assignment
- reproductive medicine

Burden of the collection

Steps taken by NHS Digital to minimise the burden of collection

In seeking to minimise the burden it imposes on others, in line with sections 253(2a) and 265(3) of the Health and Social Care Act 2012, NHS Digital has an assessment process to validate and challenge the level of burden incurred through introducing new information standards, collections and extractions.

This assessment is carried out by the Data Standards and Assurance Service (DSAS) which carries out a Detailed Burden Assessment (DBA) and reports findings and recommendations, as part of the overarching Data Alliance Partnership Board (DAPB) process. The DAPB oversees the development, assurance and acceptance of information standards, data collections and data extractions for the health and social care system in England.

As a pilot this Early Implementer data collection is out of scope of a formal burden assessment for the DAPB. However, an informal assessment of costs will take place during the pilot in preparation for these data becoming mandatory for collection (and therefore subject to a DAPB assessment).
