## Information Standards Notice – New (Version 2.0)

Acting under delegated authority from the Secretary of State for Health, the Data Coordination Board (DCB) has approved a new information standard for publication under section 250 of the Health and Social Care Act 2012.

You must comply with this new standard by the full conformance date specified below.

Standard definition	
Description	<p>In November 2016, NHS England published <a href="#">Healthy Children: Transforming Child Health Information</a>, a new digital strategy describing how making child health information more accessible can support parents and professionals in their care of children and young people and how that same information can be used to promote their health and wellbeing.</p> <p>Phase 1 of this information standard, developed by the Professional Record Standards Body (PRSB), in collaboration with NHS Digital, supports the move to sharing of child health information by setting out the Healthy Child Record specification that care providers should comply with, on a local basis, to ensure that all providers and their suppliers are using the same data in a standardised format. Care providers are required to confirm conformance with Phase 1, or ensure their suppliers do so, by submission of the Compliance Letter to NHS Digital.</p> <p>Phase 2 - <i>Interoperability and Portability</i> - of this information standard will introduce mechanisms for sharing of this standardised data across providers. The timetable for Phase 2 is not yet fixed; however those care providers which notify conformance with Phase 1 to NHS Digital will be invited to have early entry into Phase 2.</p>

Implementation and conformance dates	<p>The original Information Standards Notice (published on 13 December 2018) set a full conformance date of 1 December 2019.</p> <p>After discussion with providers and system suppliers, NHS Digital requested an extension to this conformance date. This has been agreed by the Data Coordination Board on the basis that no changes have been made to the standard.</p> <p>Full conformance is now set at 30 June 2020.</p>
