

## Information Standards Notice – MC (Mandatory Collection)

Following recommendation by the Standardisation Committee for Care Information (SCCI), the Department of Health has approved a new information standard for use.

Standard definition	
Description	<p>This release introduces the Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) Enhanced Dataset, which supersedes the current FGM Prevalence Dataset (ISB 1610).</p> <p>The enhanced dataset is in two parts:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Local recording and sharing of FGM information to support the provision of care for a woman or girl.</li> <li>2. The central collection of FGM information across acute trusts, mental health trusts and general practice.</li> </ol> <p>The local recording and sharing of FGM information is mandatory for all organisations from 1 April 2015.</p> <p>The central collection and submission of FGM information is mandatory for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• all acute trusts from 1 June 2015; however, it is requested that from 1 April 2015 all acute trusts continue to collect FGM information and submit at patient level through a different tool.</li> <li>• all mental health trusts and GP practices from 1 October 2015.</li> </ul> <p>The collection is to be held on the HSCIC Clinical Audit Platform (CAP). This will go live from 1 April 2015 and organisations can register to use CAP by visiting <a href="http://www.hscic.gov.uk/fgm">www.hscic.gov.uk/fgm</a>.</p>
Scope	NHS
Applies to	<p>All NHS funded providers must record FGM information for local use and sharing.</p> <p>All acute and mental health trusts and all GP practices must collect and submit FGM information to the HSCIC.</p>

Legal authority	<p>This information standard is published under section 250 of the Health and Social Care Act 2012.</p> <p>The data collection is the subject of Directions from the Department of Health to the HSCIC.</p>
Impact	<p>This information standard builds on the previously implemented ISB 1610 FGM Prevalence Dataset, providing a greater level of FGM information captured throughout various different health settings.
