Information Standards Notice – Change

Acting under delegated authority from the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care, the Data Coordination Board (DCB) has approved a change to an existing information standard for publication under section 250 of the Health and Social Care Act 2012.

Standard definition	
Description	<p>The Aggregate Contract Monitoring (ACM) information standard is one of a set of standards being introduced by NHS England and NHS Improvement, initially on a voluntary basis, to enable national consistency of the flow of cost and activity information from providers to commissioners. The others are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • DCB3003 Patient Level Contract Monitoring • DCB3002 Devices Patient Level Contract Monitoring • DCB2212 Drugs Patient Level Contract Monitoring. <p>Having national standards to support contract monitoring will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • reduce burden • allow simpler and more consistent reporting • allow easier reconciliation and validation of invoices • provide support for service change planning and hospital capacity analysis • improve forecasting • allow greater monitoring of equity of access to services. <p>This specific ACM standard will enable the interchange, in a uniform format, of monthly aggregate contract monitoring data between commissioners and providers of healthcare.</p> <p>Data is required to be submitted to NHS Digital on a monthly basis. In the long term, the developers will work with NHS Digital to enhance the Commissioning Data Sets to hold this information, thereby removing the need for separate flows.</p>
About this change	<p>This is a minor change to one data item – CONTRACT MONITORING ACTUAL ACTIVITY – to change the format from maxn10 to maxn10.maxn3.</p> <p>This is to allow the recording of non-integer values, for example where providers are using 0.833 to report one month in a single year of care.</p>
