Background																			
	<p>The Common User Interface information standards are out of date and should not be relied on as interface design standards. Nevertheless, there is still residual value in some of the data elements identified within them.</p> <p>Deprecation of these standards is in line with the information contained in the current version of the standards framework under consideration by NHSX. The background to the decision is given below.</p> <p>During the tenure of NHS Connecting for Health (2005-2013), a need was identified for consistency in the display of common items and their layout on screens, driven by a desire to improve patient safety and to aid clinician effectiveness. The Common User Interface (CUI) project was set up to define a common interface for healthcare IT systems and nine standards were subsequently approved (as above).</p> <p>Since their publication in 2010, the health and care technology landscape has changed considerably. It is now acknowledged that these standards are out of date. Nevertheless, there is still residual value in some of the data elements identified within them and it is the intention to review and identify elements</p>

	<p>which remain relevant to ensuring patient safety and continue to promote clinical uptake of health and care IT.</p> <p>Designers of health IT systems do not need to make immediate changes to current systems but should seek guidance from NHS Digital and they are encouraged to participate in the upcoming review. Health organisations do not need to take any immediate action.</p> <p>Formal retirement of the CUI standards is scheduled for June 2020, following the conclusion of the above review. Further communication from the Data Coordination Board will announce details of any replacement standards or where new guidance can be found.</p>
