This document provides the requirements and conformance criteria to test that the product or system complies with the requirements to support the local implementation of the International Statistical Classification of Diseases and Related Health Problems – Tenth Revision 5th Edition.

The World Health Organisation (WHO) International Statistical Classification of Diseases and Related Health Problems – Tenth Revision 4th Edition is an existing NHS information standard commonly referred to as ICD-10.

The change, provided by WHO, constitutes updates to the classification to provide improved classification of medical conditions.

This update to the standard is a continuance of the regular review and uplift to ICD-10 in line with the recommended best practice of keeping clinical classifications aligned with advances in health care.

High quality relevant data is a key commissioning tool. The requirements set out below will help organisations to meet data quality requirements to support their business and deliver better care to patients.

2	All Health Care Providers that are required to submit diagnoses for Admitted Patient Care Commissioning Data Sets (CDS), Central Returns for secondary uses as well as a number of other data collections as defined in the NHS Data Model and Dictionary MUST implement the updates in readiness for implementation on 1 April 2016. http://www.datadictionary.nhs.uk
3	Health Care Providers MUST implement ICD-10 5 th Edition data files for 1 April 2016 as described in the ICD-10 Metadata specification available via the Technology Reference data Update Distribution Service (TRUD). https://isd.hscic.gov.uk/trud3/user/guest/group/0/home
4	Health Care Providers MUST use the ICD-10 5 th Edition book set and/or ICD-10 5 th Edition eVersion and associated clinical coding standards.
